**ANGOLAN AND FOREIGN CITIZEN MARRIAGE PROCEEDINGS**

NECESSARY DOCUMENTS:

**FOR THE ANGOLAN CITIZEN:**

- Birth certificate, **valid for 12 months**, duly recognised by the **National Directorate of Registry and Notary Services** and certified by the **Ministry of Foreign Affairs**.
- Residence Certificate issued by the Municipal Administration of the area of residence, valid for 3 months and **translated into Portuguese by a sworn translator**. **Once translated, the document must be approved by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs**.
- Consular Registration Certificate.
- Passport.
- Identity card.
- For the groom, at ages between 18 and 30 years, regularised military situation (submission of the military census certificate).
- Criminal record.
- 2 recent colour identification photos.

**FOR THE FOREIGN CITIZEN:**

- Birth Certificate authenticated by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Consulate of Angola, accredited by the country of origin of the applicant and **translated into Portuguese by a sworn translator**. **Once translated, the document must be approved by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs**.
- Residence Certificate issued by the Municipal Administration of the area of residence, valid for 3 months and **translated into Portuguese by a sworn translator**. **Once translated, the document must be approved by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs**.
- Passport or Identity Card.



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- Criminal record, translated into Portuguese by a sworn translator. Once translated, the document must be approved by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
- 2 recent colour identification photos.

NOTE 1: The marriage proceedings require the presence of the individuals contracting matrimony or of the legal representative of one of them, bearing a power of attorney or Public Instrument.

NOTE 2: In the act of marriage, the foreign individual must be accompanied by an official translator, in case they do not master the Portuguese language.
